September 10, 2021
Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 12:58 pm by president Janice Batchelder. There were no visitors. Sandy Hughes moved and Dee Goodrich seconded to accept the previous meeting's minutes. The motion carried.

Membership Chair Gail Spencer introduced a new member, Jeri Kennedy.

Treasurer Pam Todd reported that our income for the past month (minus Art in the Redwoods income) was \$105.00. Expenses for the period were \$160.76. The bank balance as of August 31, 2021 is \$24,816.54.

Dee Goodrich is the sole person on the Program Committee and needs two additional helpers. Laura Fogg will be the November speaker and this meeting will be held outside at GAC. Jennie Henderson will not be able to do our October dyeing workshop.

Sandy Hughes and Francie Angwin reminded us that entries can be submitted for the 2021 Challenge Show, "Flying Free" until September 24. Quilts made for the 2020 challenge (which was canceled) can be submitted to this show.

The 2022 Challenge show will be in May 2022. The title is "Fresh Beginnings—Healing Our Earth." People are encouraged to use natural items in their entries. Sylvia Evans and Della Zita are heading up this committee.

Jan Carter reported that she, Barbara Dunsmoor, and Cheryl Faconti are working on the 2022 Art in the Redwoods Quilt.

Judy Riddle reported that our Art in the Redwoods booth grossed about \$3,000.00. GAC's percentage and taxes will be deducted from that. Judy thanked all who helped on the committee, Marcia Luchini, Darla Buechner, Cheryl Faconti, Sylvia Evans, Francie Angwin, and Sandy Hughes. She also thanked everyone who helped out in the booth, with setting up, and taking down. Winter Wonderland 2021 will be held for the entire month after Thanksgiving.

Marcia Luchini reported that she has not given out many comfort quilts, but it is always good to have plenty on hand. Quilts appropriate for males, females, and children are all appreciated.

Sandy Lockhart reported to Janice that she and Lori would like to make a November delivery to the Palo Alto Veterans Hospital. So please have your Quilts of Valor in to Sandy by October 30.

Cheryl Faconti spoke about the suggested PPQG t-shirts. She knows a graphic designer, and we have access to someone who can print them. She showed us a mock-up of what the design might look like.

Judy Riddle and Sylvia Evans do not know if the Holiday Luncheon will be able to be held in-person or on a "drive-through" basis. The menu is vegetable quiche, salad, roll, and cake.

Publicist Sandy Hughes said she would put information about our challenge show in the ICO.
