2018 CHALLENGE

IT's a Journey! It's a Challenge!

Time is flying by & although our show is not until October, we all need to get going! Have **you** started your Challenge Quilt yet? Or your second piece? Let's make it the most amazing show ever --- showing the community the talents of all of our wonderful quilters and introducing everyone to the many forms of quilted art. Make a big one, make a little one, make several! We want to display all forms – large pieces, wall quilts, miniquilts & post cards too.

The theme is "Journey." Inspiration may come from travel, a life experience, an accomplishment, a dream........... Your interpretation can be represented in a traditional quilt, a modern quilt, an art quilt. Have fun!!!! Use your imagination!!!!

There is no size limitation but your piece must include a specific piece of fabric:

5 square inches of Quilted Treasures Scrollscape in Indigo – available from Carole Garcia or purchase larger amounts from the Loft. Must be identifiable in the front of the quilt; it may be cut into small pieces, pieced into the quilt top, appliqued or fused, incorporated in embellishment or used in the border; We would also like to promote mini-quilts so requirements for smaller quilts: Fat quarter size or smaller, minimum of this blue fabric must be 3 square inches. If really small – postcard size (or 4"x6") or smaller 1 ½ sq inches will do.

The Challenge show, as usual, will be held at Gualala Arts -- opening is the evening of Friday October 5, 2018. The show will run 6 weeks. Your work will be due on Wed. October 3 with hanging set for Thursday October 4. So, let's get going!

FROM THE BOOKSHELVES

Thanks to a generous donor we now have Kaffe Fassett's THREE latest books in our library (9 of his titles in all).

They are *Bold Blooms* from 2016; *Quilts in Ireland* from 2017, and *Welcome Home* –also 2017.

Since I had first dibs, I was fascinated to study the range of Fassett's use of color and value. In one book it's ALL about medium value (no value contrast, only color contrast,) and similar intensities to make quilts and settings that harmonize.

Another book plays with value in various ways, for instance by using only VERY dark jewel tones that glow against a dark background.

Kaffe doesn't spend many words spelling out his color philosophy, or philosophies, but the lessons are there to be learned when you study the images.

And if you don't want to study – all three books are gorgeous additions to your library.
