Comfort Quilt Workshop Fanny Basket January 15, 2021

I hope all you creative souls are looking forward to our zoom comfort quilt workshop in January of the New Year. I know it has been difficult to access the fanny basket this last year, so I brought home the bin of fabric from the Christmas luncheon in an attempt to have it available for those who would like some fabric to work with during the comfort quilt workshop in January. (This fabric was donated to our guild by the family of a college professor of Textiles and Design). Their intention was so see it used in a charitable way and therefore we would like it used for comfort quilts. It is the perfect time to reenergize our efforts to replenish all those comfort quilts we gave out this year! It was hard to think of another way to get some more fanny fabric out there, but I am willing to put this fabric out on my front porch daily, from January 6th through January 12th, so that we can have a contactless experience. This will give you time to acquire any additional fabric needed to make a comfort quilt from your stash or from the Loft in town. All of the fabric is in bundles with other coordinating fabric that you might use, but you most likely will need some solids, as many of them are floral designs. Please call me ahead of time (884-3888) and I will leave my gate open and wave to you from inside if I'm here. If you need some quick and simple ideas for guilts, check out Pinterest, there are many contributors that have some great ideas. Here are some I have checked out: Nancy Crow guilting, quiltylove.com, favequilts.com, scrappy quilt, and big block quilts. Please help us out and have some fun, even if it takes you all the way into the next comfort quilt workshop in May or June,

New Program

Each month--beginning January 2021-- guild members will be challenged to make a particular item to be sold at the fundraiser sales (AIR /FOT). Anyone who completes the specified item <u>in that month</u>, will deliver it to Judy Riddle, Sylvia Evans, Sandy Hughes or Janice Batchelder by the end of that month. A ticket with their name on it will be placed "in the basket". Each month will be a different challenge, i.e. a potholder, a certain quilt block, a specific tree ornament, etc. You only get "a ticket in the basket" if you finish the specified item and give it to one of the four designated members in that given month.

Each item you finish will go into the fundraiser booths (AIR & FOT). You are encouraged to make more than one, if possible, and a ticket will be put in the basket for each of the specified items you make <u>in that month</u>, i.e. if the challenge in January is to make a potholder and you make 10 potholders in January, you get 10 tickets. You only get a ticket for the specific item you are asked to make in that month, <u>finish</u> the project by the end of that specific month and turn it in to one of the four designated members.

Your reward? Judy Riddle became the recipient of an orphaned quilt top and will finish the quilt with "custom" quilting. At the PPQG Holiday lunch in December 2021, a name will be drawn from all those tickets people have earned all year. The winner will receive the completed "custom" quilted quilt. Winner does not need to be present at the lunch to win.

To start the New Year, and to give you time to complete the project by the end of January 2021, you are asked to make **one set** of potholders (two potholders that match). It appears what sells best is a "set" of potholders (two that match), as well as those made with earth colors or ocean colored fabrics. Remember, the potholder must have a layer of insulbrite sandwiched between layers of batting. i.e. fabric, batting, insulbrite, batting, fabric. The potholder set must be finished and turned in by January 31, 2021, to receive a "ticket for the basket". You will receive a ticket for "each" potholder **set** (two potholders that match) that you turn in. This is an opportunity to try a new block or to make a potholder out of an orphan block.

February's challenge will be announced in the January Newsletter.

The more involvement in the project by the membership, the better. If you have an idea for a project that could be completed in a month, please contact Judy Riddle, Sylvia Evans, Sandy Hughes or Janice Batchelder.
