In past years the quilt winner was someone who purchased their ticket the last hour of the sale, as you can see from the statement above, this year's winner purchased his ticket in July. This could be an incentive to finish the raffle quilt and hang it in the spring or summer. No pressure!!

Fundraising Sale

There were several last-minute changes in plans for the fundraiser booth this year: notice that tickets had to be pre-purchased at the Dolphin, no tickets would be sold at the event; limit to the number of people allowed into AIR each day, due to COVID; all special events were outside; masks were mandatory everywhere; social distancing; COVID restrictions on food and drinks. We had to reduce the number of volunteers in our booth, but the sale went on. Even with all the changes and restrictions, our sales totaled \$3,355. This number will be reduced once the 10% fee is deducted along with state tax and credit card fees. However, this is an all-time high in sales, making it a pretty good sale. Activity was a little slow on Saturday afternoon, but Sunday was quite busy. A complete reverse from prior years.



I have to add I believe one reason our sale was so lucrative was due to the wonderful products we had available. The contributions and participation from all of you was a definite plus. Our highest sales continued to be stuffed animals and microwave bowls. However, pot holders, placemats with napkins, table runners and quilts sold well. Overall we sold 28% of our inventory. This still gives us plenty of items to sell at Winter Wonderland. However, please continue to turn in your creative works and incorporate some Christmas. Thank you to all of you creative quilters. Thank you, also, to those who helped with set up, take down and sales during AIR: Sandy Hughes, Cheryl Faconti, Janice Batchelder, Della Zita, Sylvia Evans, her husband, and her two friends, Cindy and Dianne; Marcia Luchini, Francie Angwin, and a big thank you to Darla Buechner for filling out the sales tickets and reconciling the monies.

I believe we have had enough rules and restrictions over the last many months so I am encouraging you to use your own imagination and do one or all of the following:

- Simply enter the quilt you made for the 2020 "A • Star is Born" as your 2021 entry, and/or
- Add some silver to your 2020 "A Star is Born" to celebrate our 25th Anniversary, and/or
- Make a quilt of your own design choice adding • silver to celebrate our 25th Anniversary
- Enter the quilt you made for the 2020 "A Star is Born" together with any other quilt design of your choice without silver
- Enter a quilt design of you own choice as your only entry keeping in mind that it cannot be more than 2 years old or ever shown in a GAC Art Exhibit.

In summary, you can enter last year's quilt as your only entry or make one for 2021 or do both. The silver is a suggestion and not a requirement.

Please note: As of this date, due to COVID-19 regulations from state and county - No food or drink will be consumed during opening receptions. "Members Reception" will take place during the first Friday, October 1, of the exhibit from 4-7 PM and will allow Gualala Arts members a chance to preview our exhibit. The second reception on Saturday, October 2, will be open to the public. For group exhibits such as ours, GAC is encouraging artists to take turns acting as docent so that we may interact with our potential patrons while reducing the number of artists in the gallery at one time. I will update you as I receive more information from the Gualala Arts Center staff.
