FUNDRAISING SALE

Our sales at Winter Wonderland were a HUGE success. After Thanksgiving weekend, I received calls from several people telling me our inventory was "very" low. The extensive work you ladies put into making items for the sale definitely was accepted by those looking for something to purchase. PPQG received a check from GAC for the Winter Wonderland Net Proceeds (for November only) in the amount of \$3,262.50! And we will receive an additional check for sales in the month of December.

After examination of our inventory before Christmas, we had 6 microwave bowls left, 7 stuffed animals, 4 placemat sets, 7 coaster sets, 26 quilts, 1 apron, and reduced quantities of every other item. As I mentioned above, I'm afraid we will need to schedule several production-line style workdays to make microwave bowls and stuffed animals. I scared myself when I did an analysis of what sold, how many items we made and how many items we will need to make for the 2022 sales.

We have gone through some of our donated fabric stash and put together some kits with the correct amounts of fabrics AND a pattern. Our plan is to have people doing different jobs, at different stations. Using this method, we hope to get several quilt tops done in a day.

We will have cutting stations, sewing stations, ironing runners and maybe even pinning stations for quilting!

We would like to thank our new member Jeri Kennedy for helping us with this great idea.

We will have as much of the Fanny Basket as we can bring out for your choosing pleasure to make additional Comfort Quilts! Feel free to bring any quick, easy patterns you think might be useful.

We are not sure, at this time, if the workshop will be at The Gualala Art Center or The Community Center because of the ever-changing COVID restrictions. **The time and location will be emailed to you in January.**

Plan to bring your sewing machine, thread (white, cream, light gray and black), your rotary cutter, cutting mat, and your standard cutting rulers, (including "square-up" rulers)as well as the standard sewing supplies.

Hospitality will prepare a lovely lunch for all to enjoy. Plan to "spend the day" if possible. We hope to see you there!

Quilt Challenge 2022

"Fresh Beginnings: Healing our Earth"

PPQG Quilt Challenge May 2022: GAC has a call to artists show called "Power of Hope" for January. How does this tie in with our Quilt Challenge? In the realm of psychology hope leads to healing. With that in mind, our 2022 Quilt Challenge theme is "Fresh Beginnings: Healing our Earth". Your project will be a way of acknowledging the challenges we face as a people and to promote a collective healing through the art of quilting, with emphasis on healing. Inspiration can come from anywhere or anything affecting the delicate balance of our culture and environment. This past year we've enjoyed some great zoom presentations showcasing modern quilts, scrappy quilts and embellishing quilts using threads among others. We encourage quilters to use their imaginations, get out of their comfort zones by challenging themselves to do something they haven't done before and perhaps experience some healing through the process. There are no material requirements; however, using natural, sustainable materials or upcycling items that are no longer wanted or needed into a project are recommended and encouraged. We hope you are finding inspiration all around you and are beginning the creative process for your 2022 Quilt Challenge project. We're encouraging guilters to submit artist statements with their entries. We'll talk more about artist's statements in the coming months. Feel free to google "Quilters Artist Statements" and keep in mind what your process involves, like inspiration, fabric, pattern selection etc. Basically what is the story behind your quilt? Happy planning.

2022 Challenge Rules

1) Make a quilt of your own design and/or pattern/color choice

2) Natural Fibers are recommended but not required

3) Repurposing/upcycling items that are no longer wanted or needed into a quilt giving those materials new life is encouraged4) No maximum or minimum sizes

As no one has come forward to Chair the Program Committee, a group of interested members came together to split the tasks and developed a preliminary plan for program and workshops for 2022. As the plans are finalized, they will be published. Please note these first two events and put them on your calendar.

January 21 – Comfort Quilt/Quilt of Valor Workshop

As mentioned above, bundles of coordinating fabrics along with a pattern have been prepared. A few kits have already been cut and are ready to sew. We hope to have Comfort quilts in different stages and work as a production line to get them finalized "in a day". There will be cutting stations, ironing stations, sewers, and possibly tops that can be sandwiched. Bring any UFOs you'd like to donate for finishing, any quick and easy pattern ideas. And don't forget the sewing machine, threads, standard sewing supplies, and cutting tools.

February 18 – All day workshop making Microwave Bowls and Stuffed Animals. We need to produce at least 200(!!!) Microwave bowls and at least 50 stuffed animals!

<u>Microwave bowls</u>—Many of you are not thrilled with making microwave bowls, but maybe we can divide the jobs and conquer the task! Again we will set up workstations: those who want to cut fabric and batting, those who can sew X's, those who can mark the darts, those who can sew the darts, those who can sew the two parts together and those who can do the final closing.

Stuffed Animals—Sylvia Keller has graciously given us her stuffed animal patterns. Specific patterns will be identified, fabric selections made and the production line process will begin: cutting, sewing, stuffing, finishing. Bring your sewing machine, threads, needles for hand sewing, any fabrics you think might be useful, and your sewing tools (scissors, marking tool, seam ripper, turning tools, i.e. skewers, stuffing tools, i.e. hemostats), fiberfill stuffing(?).
