June 17 - Guild meeting and Comfort Quilt/QOV Workshop, 10AM - 4PM at Gualala Community Center

Bring your projects, sewing machine, rulers, cutters, and usual sewing tools. Remember to RSVP to the Hospitality Committee, Sylvia Evans and Cheryl Faconti so they know how much food to have available. The Fanny Basket bins will be on site for your perusal. Please consider a Comfort Quilt/Quilt of Valor pattern that might be conducive to using the fabrics in the Fanny Basket bins.

July 15 – Guild Picnic at the GAC picnic area. Noon

August – No meeting. Art in the Redwoods fundraiser.

September 15 – Workshop by Cheryl Nyland "Whimsical Fabric Faces"

In this class you will learn how to put together a face for a pillow, wall hanging or framed art.

We will learn how to use fabric scraps or salvage edges, to make hair, eyes, nose and mouths. You will also learn how to use thread to enhance the face. Works well with Kaffe Fassett fabric collection as flowers for hair or with whimsical accents. No art experience needed.

Materials needed for fabric face class

1 yard of steam a seam lite2

20X20 background fabric (I like to use black and white fabric) or something with only two colors. 20X20 batting can Frankenstein to make a 20X20 piece.

20X20 piece to use as quilt backing (anything works if you are making a pillow, it won't show.)

1/4 to 1/2 yard Fabric of choice for hair (I love Kaffe fabrics for hair.)

20X24 fabric for pillow backing

1X20 Velcro for pillow closure.

Scraps of fabric for eyes, nose, mouth and eyebrows.

Small to Med sharp scissors (I love my medium Karen Buckley ones)

Scissors to cut paper.

45 MM rotary cutter.

Pencil, tweezers, safety pins, and many colors of threads for face details.

Sewing machine with free motion foot.

Cheryl will provide face fabrics and a glue stick for each participant in the class.

She began by making silly character images of family and friends just as gifts. She was a hit, and everyone wanted one! Ladies of the Lake Quilt Guild has openings for our June 12th workshop if your members are interested. Please pass this your members. on to Kim Brownell calls herself the "Wackydoodle Quilter" due to her easy-going, whimsical style. She says that she doesn't always follow the rules and tends to ignore the "Quilting Police". Her work uses bright colors, animals and nature scenes. Kim blends fabric collage, free form art quilts, raw-edge applique and other techniques. Her lecture on Saturday June 11th at the Lakeport Senior Center is called, "Yes, you can put it on your quilt!" She will share with us how to put just about anything on our projects. In this lecture, we will learn ways to use adhesives in our projects. Kim will show us many samples in a trunk show, plus take home a handout for future reference. Our workshop on Sunday, June 12th at the Scotts Valley Women's Club in Lakeport, uses a Quilted Jigsaw Puzzle Technique. We will be making a 22' x 26" Sunrise/Sunset wall hanging. It is very much like piecing together a jigsaw puzzle. A raw-edge fusible applique is used leaving a negative space between each piece. The background fabric can be in any color, but if black is used the piece will have a wonderful stained glass look. This is a fun class for both beginner and experienced quilters. (\$20 kit is required with a check made out to Kim Brownell or cash on Sunday, includes pattern, pre-traced black background, and #805 Wonder Under). This is something that I think we could mostly finish in one afternoon. Most people get about 2/3 done with top. That's why you don't have to bring a machine to class! The nice thing is that the sewing and quilting are done at the same time. If you are interested, please send a check for \$25 made out to LLQG and your name, email, and phone number that you are interested and I'll put you on the list and send you the supply list.
