Attendance at Art in the Redwoods was a little sparse sometimes, however, those of us in the PPQG sales booth were kept busy.



Thank you to everyone for all of your wonderful contributions. The customers really enjoyed your items. A few men were thumbing through the potholders and very excited to find some that met "their" criteria. Ladies were thrilled to find such a wonderful variety of microwave bowls. One lady bought 12 to take back to her lady friends and returned Sunday to buy 2 more. Grandparents were overjoyed with the "stuffies" and bought 2 and 4 at a time to give to their grandchildren. Of course the little ones were awestruck with the stuffed animals and had difficulty deciding which ONE they wanted. One little boy was greeting everyone at the door to show them his little kitty.

Sandy Hughes and Darla Buechner for their assistance with sales, as well as set-up and takedown each day. Thank you to Francie and Joe for schlepping the hanging racks to/from GAC. Thank you to John Luchini and Larry Riddle for hanging the banners, display lattice, the AIIR quilt and general set up on Friday. And a special thank you to Darla Buechner for efficiently handling the sales tickets, cash and the credit card sales. It got a little hectic sometimes, but everything totaled at the end.



Our sales totaled \$3288. GAC will back out taxes, and fees then issue a check to PPQG. Again the microwave bowls were the top seller (89) followed by the stuffed animals (30). We sold 4 of our 12 aprons, 3 of 11 placemat sets, 20 of the 67 potholders, 5 of 33 quilts, 1 of 16 table runners, 2 of 27 coaster sets, 4 of 9 tote bags. And a new item, introduced by Cheryl Faconti, microwave tortilla warmers. We sold 7 of the 10 warmers Cheryl made. Cheryl will be making more warmers for FOT. They are much easier to make than bowls. Cheryl will be happy to share the pattern and instructions.
