Quilts of Valor Update

Jan Carter has proposed a **collaborative Quilt of Valor** to be made using a "block-in-a-block" design. She has asked all members to make two 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' square blocks using only red, white and blue fabric. A central square (2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " or 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") should be surrounded by one of the colors to create a 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ ' square. You should write your first name somewhere on the front of the block (but not on the edge). Jan will assemble the quilt block from your contributions. If you have questions, contact her.
