# **Membership**

July Featured Member:

I often say that I learned to appliqué from my grandmother. That evokes a sweet picture, but it's not completely true. My grandmother ran a small daycare center in her house in San Rafael. Cramped quarters and chaos was often the order of the day. Amid the mayhem, Granny sat tranquilly, perched at the end of the kitchen table, hands steadied on top of the Sears Catalog, quietly applying some small piece of calico to a larger piece of white cloth with coarse white household thread. On the other end of the table, her little granddaughter, her helpmate in this child rearing enterprise, sat bored and anxious. When Granny found me in this state, she sent me off to my room with a square of white fabric, a coloring book from which to trace

When Granny found me in this state, she sent me off to my room with a square of white fabric, a coloring book from which to trace and a bag of scraps. With these tools and her encouragement, I taught myself to design patterns and appliqué. That was 50 years ago – and I am still working to learn and improve. My Interest in Mountain Mist Quilt Patterns has the same origin, my grandmother.

She kept a handkerchief box stuffed with her special collection of Mountain Mist patterns. I remember how she carefully selected a pattern, slowly opened it, and, spreading it across the table like a map, told me all about the design. I was a very little girl, under 10 years old, but she spoke to me like an adult, sharing all of the intricacies of the pattern. I became her confederate in collecting and curating these patterns. I carried on this quest long after her death, finally completing the pattern collection a few years ago. I use the patterns to share the history of appliqué and quilt making in the 1930s and to teach basic techniques. In 2011 I formed a small group of appliqué enthusiasts committed to reviving the appliqué quilts from the Mountain Mist pattern collection of the 30's. We meet monthly and have completed 37 – at last count.
