One option is using the 3" squares donated by Susanne Sholtz to make a red, white, and blue disappearing 4-patch block and mixing these blocks with plain white blocks. You can also choose to make a quit pattern of your own choice.

We have prepared a letter from PPQG to be sent to surrounding quilt guilds asking for if they could possibly donate a Veteran quilt or fabrics to help us reach our goal. These letters will go out in January. Several members indicated at the November guild meeting that they have Veteran quilts either in progress or in their project planning for 2026. Thank you.

### 2026 Retreat

I hope many of you are planning on attending the retreat in February. Dates are **February 2-5** at the Oxford Suites Hotel in Rohnert Park. Room rates are \$130.00 per night and rooms can be shared. But the difference is that we had a one-time "grant" from the guild last year to help underwrite the cost.
